History of Pickling

Pickling is the process of preserving food in an acid solution, usually vinegar.

Pickles have a very long history and are found across all cultures. The earliest known examples are cucumbers that are known to have been pickled sometime around 2030 BC in Mesopotamia, when inhabitants from northern India brought cucumber seeds to the Tigris valley.

Pickles were known to the ancient Egyptians when Cleopatra attributed some of her beauty to pickles, and Aristotle praised the healing effects of pickled cucumbers. The Romans imported all sorts of foods from the countries they conquered, pickling them for the journey in vinegar, oil, brine and sometimes honey.



Notable pickle-lovers from history include Queen Elizabeth I of England.
